

Sexual Assault Prevention for Graduate Students (Formerly Known as Haven Plus)
Instructions Guide

Dear Students,

Emory University is actively working toward a campus in which no student fears or experiences violence. Sexual Assault Prevention for Graduate Students (Formerly Known as Haven Plus). Through it you will learn about preventing and responding to multiple forms of interpersonal violence, including sexual assault, harassment, relationship abuse, and stalking in the Emory community. Every incoming transfer, undergraduate, graduate, and professional student at Emory is required to complete this module.

As part of our comprehensive prevention program for students, Emory University expects you to complete Sexual Assault Prevention for Graduate Students (Formerly Known as Haven Plus). This online education will empower you to make well-informed decisions about issues that affect your years at Emory and beyond.

Sexual Assault Prevention for Graduate Students is a relatively short program: Part 1 takes approximately 45 minutes to complete, and Part 2 (a follow up survey sent 6 weeks after Part 1 is finished) takes approximately 15 minutes to complete.

It is possible that something you read during the training will evoke an emotional response, whether or not you have experienced violence or trauma yourself. This hotline can also connect you with confidential in-person support in your area.

Please note that this is a required course and punitive measures are subject depending on your program if you fail to complete both Part 1 and Part 2 by the provided deadline (e.g., hold on course registration).
