

ADDENDUM REGARDING GRADED CREDIT REQUIREMENT

(THIS LANGUAGE TO BE ADDED TO PART 1: DEGREE REQUIREMENTS > DEGREE REQUIREMENTS > DEGREE CREDIT HOURS; TO BECOME PARAGRAPH 2

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Students who study for three years at Emory Law must earn, at a minimum, 72 credits of graded coursework. For dual degree students, a minimum of 72 of their 79 law school credits need to be earned through graded coursework. For students who transfer to Emory after their 1L year or who spend an entire year away at another law school as transient students, 48 units of graded coursework is the required minimum (out of a possible 60 units). For all students, “earning credits through graded coursework” requires taking and receiving a passing grade in a law school course. A student facing extraordinary and unforeseen circumstances could petition the Dean or their designee to waive the “graded coursework” requirement in his/her/their individual case, thereby lowering the number of credits that must be earned through graded coursework to receive the JD degree.
